Owner:

Maryknoll Sisters. Founders and owners.

Lead/Managing Partner: Pando Populus (a 501(c)3 organization). Manages new relationships. Brings in anchor institutions and other partners aiming for long-term, collaborative, mission-driven commitment.

Anchor Institutions:

Secured over the development period, we expect to include organizations aiming for a more sustainable LA County.

We will work in consultation with religious organizations (e.g., Union Theological Seminary, Columbia University), urban farming initiatives focused on community gardens and similar, selected members of the CSO (Chief Sustainability Officer) Strategic Taskforce – which unites the CSOs of academia, business, and government. for a more sustainable LA County – and more.

Supporting Institutions:

We anticipate the involvement of institutions from such areas as: urban forestry and watershed support (e.g., Amigos de los Rios); environmental education (e.g., LeapLab); social impact design (e.g., the university-based Think Wrong community of social impact innovators), and others.
